Every Survivor Counts in an organization whose mission is to address multifaceted forms of oppression and end sexual violence by empowering survivors through person-first services and community engagement.



Refuge works to prevent childhood exposure to violence and abuse through direct therapeutic work with families, supportive services for child-serving organizations, and community-wide prevention education.



Mountains to Molehills provides relief for the purpose of improving the lives of the impoverished through appliance repair/replacements, home repairs, auto repairs, or other activities that might provide relief and service to low income families.



SOAR is a 10-session weekly Psychoeducation group providing education and activities related to relevant topics and critical to promoting resilient adolescents. Some of these topics include healthy relationships, conflict resolution, impacts of violence, and empathy.

CASA (Court Appointed Special Advocates for Children) are volunteers that are appointed by judges to watch over and advocate for abused and neglected children, to make sure they don't get lost in the overburdened legal and social service system or languish in inappropriate group or foster homes.



Amare will advocate, communicate and encourage change for those suffering from drug/alcohol addiction, depression, and/or suicidal tendencies along with the families and community.

Group Interventions is a social service agency serving domestic violence abusers in Madison, Bond and St. Clair County. Their mission is focused on the safety of women and children.



Pathways Counseling provides professional, confidential, Christian counseling to the individuals and families living in and near the Riverbend community
